>> 1976 STUDY DESCRIPTION

THE CPS 1976 AMERICAN NATIONAL ELECTION STUDY WAS CONDUCTED BY THE CENTER FOR POLITICAL STUDIES OF THE INSTITUTE FOR SOCIAL RESEARCH, THE UNIVERSITY OF MICHIGAN UNDER THE DIRECTION OF WARREN E. MILLER AND ARTHUR H. MILLER. IT WAS THE FOURTEENTH IN A SERIES OF STUDIES OF NATIONAL ELECTIONS PRODUCED BY THE POLITICAL BEHAVIOR PROGRAM OF THE SURVEY RESEARCH CENTER AND THE CENTER FOR POLITICAL STUDIES. THE STUDY WAS SUPPORTED BY A GRANT FROM THE THE NATIONAL SCIENCE FOUNDATION (SOC 76-13562).

RESPONDENTS WERE INTERVIEWED BOTH BEFORE AND AFTER THE 1976 ELECTION. THE PRE-ELECTION QUESTIONNAIRE WAS

ADMINISTERED TO 2,248 RESPONDENTS AND THE POST-ELECTION QUESTIONNAIRE WAS ADMINISTERED TO 1,909 RESPONDENTS. THE DESIGN OF THE 1976 STUDY INCLUDES A SUBSET OF RESPONDENTS WHO HAD PREVIOUSLY BEEN INTERVIEWED IN BOTH THE 1972 POST-ELECTION SURVEY AND THE 1974 ELECTION STUDY. THIS SET OF PANEL RESPONDENTS WAS THEN AUGMENTED WITH A SET OF NEW INTERVIEWS SELECTED TO PROVIDE A REPRESENTATIVE CROSS-SECTION OF U.S. CITIZENS WHEN COMBINED WITH THE NON-MOVING PANEL RESPONDENTS. NEW RESPONDENTS WERE NOT, HOWEVER, SELECTED AT THE SAME SAMPLING RATE AS PANEL RESPONDENTS; THUS WEIGHTING WAS NECESSARY TO FORM A REPRESENTATIVE CROSS-SECTION FROM THE TWO TYPES OF RESPONDENTS.

THE PRIMARY OBJECTIVE OF THIS STUDY WAS ANALYSIS OF CURRENT ATTITUDES AND VOTING PATTERNS OF A CROSS-SECTION OF AMERICAN CITIZENS, PARTICULARLY IN COMPARISON WITH ATTITUDES AND VOTING PATTERNS FOUND IN PREVIOUS CROSS-SECTION STUDIES. AS IN PAST ELECTION STUDIES, EMPHASIS WAS PLACED ON HOW THE CANDIDATES, PARTIES, AND ISSUES AFFECTED THE POLITICAL BEHAVIOR OF RESPONDENTS. IN ADDITION, THE IMPACT OF THE MASS MEDIA, PARTICULARLY THE 1976 PRESIDENTIAL DEBATES, AND THE GENERAL THEMES OF ALIENATION AND TRUST IN GOVERNMENT WERE INVESTIGATED.

CONTENT OF INTERVIEWS

THE CPS AMERICAN NATIONAL ELECTION STUDY EXPLORED POLITICAL ATTITUDES AND BEHAVIOR IN THE CONTEXT OF THE 1976 CAMPAIGN AND ELECTION. ITEMS DEALING SPECIFICALLY WITH THE CAMPAIGN AND ELECTION ELICITED RESPONDENTS' INTEREST IN THE CAMPAIGN, CONCERN FOR THE OUTCOME OF THE ELECTION, AND EVALUATION OF THE CANDIDATES, AS WELL AS THEIR VOTING BEHAVIOR. THE PARTY IDENTIFICATION OF THE RESPONDENTS, THEIR VOTING HISTORY, INFORMATION ABOUT FACETS OF EARLY POLITICAL SOCIALIZATION, AND THE RESPONDENTS' EVALUATION OF THE POLITICAL PARTIES WERE ALSO OBTAINED.

SIMILAR TO PAST STUDIES, THE QUESTIONNAIRE INCLUDED AN IDENTIFICATION OF THE MAJOR PROBLEMS THOUGHT TO BE FACING THE COUNTRY. A SERIES OF QUESTIONS DEALT WITH THE RESPONDENTS' SENSE OF POLITICAL EFFICACY AND CIVIC DUTY, THE DEGREE OF THEIR TRUST IN GOVERNMENT, AND THEIR EVALUATIONS OF GOVERNMENT RESPONSIVENESS. RACE RELATIONS AND THE CONTROVERSIAL ISSUE OF BUSING WERE INVESTIGATED WITH BOTH OPEN-ENDED AND STRUCTURED QUESTIONS. RESPONDENTS WERE ALSO ASKED TO INDICATE THEIR FEELINGS TOWARD POTENTIAL CANDIDATES AND GROUP INFLUENCES IN AMERICAN LIFE AND POLITICS ON A "FEELING THERMOMETER." ANOTHER SERIES OF ISSUE SCALES MEASURED THE RESPONDENTS' POSITION AND THEIR PERCEPTIONS OF THE POSITIONS OF THE POLITICAL PARTIES, POSITIONS OF CERTAIN POLITICAL LEADERS AND VARIOUS SOCIAL GROUPS WITH REGARD TO POLITICAL ISSUES SUCH AS BUSING, WOMEN'S LIBERATION, MARIJUANA USE, NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE, THE RIGHTS OF ACCUSED PERSONS, AID TO MINORITIES, AND THE IMPORTANCE OF GOVERNMENT GUARANTEES OF LIVING STANDARDS. RESPONDENTS WERE FURTHER ASKED TO EVALUATE THEMSELVES, THE PARTIES, AND THE CANDIDATES ON A LIBERAL-CONSERVATIVE

SCALE.

THE STUDY ALSO CONTAINED SPECIFIC INQUIRIES INTO THE IMPACT OF THE MASS MEDIA. A SERIES OF QUESTIONS EXAMINED MEDIA USAGE IN GENERAL, AS WELL AS HOW THE MEDIA WERE USED AS A SOURCE OF CAMPAIGN INFORMATION. IN ADDITION, A SERIES OF QUESTIONS WAS DESIGNED TO MEASURE THE IMPACT OF THE 1976 PRESIDENTIAL DEBATES ON POLITICAL LEARNING AND INFORMATION HOLDING.

OTHER SERIES OF QUESTIONS DEALT WITH NON-POLITICAL ISSUES. RESPONDENTS WERE QUESTIONED ABOUT PERCEPTIONS OF THEIR OWN FINANCIAL CONDITION AS WELL AS BUSINESS AND ECONOMIC CONDITIONS IN THE NATION AS A WHOLE. RESPONDENTS WERE QUESTIONED ABOUT PERCEPTIONS OF THEIR OWN LIFE IN A SERIES OF QUESTIONS DESIGNED TO MEASURE PERSONAL ESTEEM, TRUST AND QUALITY OF LIFE.

THE PERSONAL DATA SECTION CONTAINED A WIDE VARIETY OF INFORMATION ABOUT THE RESPONDENTS AND THEIR FAMILIES. INFORMATION WAS SOUGHT ON EDUCATION, OCCUPATION, UNION MEMBERSHIP(S), AGE, SEX, MARITAL STATUS AND FAMILY COMPOSITION, SOCIOECONOMIC STATUS, ETHNIC BACKGROUND, INCOME LEVEL AND RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION.

>> 1976 SAMPLING INFORMATION

THE SAMPLE FOR THE CENTER FOR POLITICAL STUDIES' 1976
AMERICAN NATIONAL ELECTION STUDY WAS A COMBINATION OF THREE
OVERLAPPING SAMPLES, EACH ONE DERIVED FROM THE INITIAL CPS
1972 ELECTION STUDY SAMPLE FRAME. THE 1972 SAMPLE WAS
SUPPLEMENTED TO ATTAIN REPRESENTATION OF ALL HOUSING UNITS
(HU'S) AND CITIZENS ADDED TO THE STUDY UNIVERSE AFTER THE
FALL OF 1972. THE SAMPLING OF HOUSEHOLD UNITS UTILIZED THE
SURVEY RESEARCH CENTER'S MASTER FRAME OF COTERMINOUS UNITED
STATES: HOUSING UNITS EXCLUSIVE OF INSTITUTIONAL POPULATIONS.
A MORE DETAILED DESCRIPTION OF THIS SAMPLING PROCEDURE CAN
BE FOUND IN LESLIE KISH AND IRENE HESS, "THE SURVEY RESEARCH

UNIVERSITY OF MICHIGAN).

THE 1976 CROSS-SECTION SAMPLE DESIGN

THE 1976 ELECTION STUDY WAS DESIGNED TO PRODUCE BOTH A REPRESENTATIVE CROSS-SECTION SAMPLE OF UNITED STATES ADULT CITIZENS AND TO COMPLETE A THREE WAVE (1972-1974-1976) PANEL STUDY. THIS "DUAL" DESIGN FEATURE OF THE STUDY WAS MOST EFFICIENTLY SERVED BY CONSTRUCTING A CROSS-SECTION SAMPLE STARTED WITH THE 1972 SAMPLE FRAME. IT THEN COMBINED ALL HOUSING UNITS (HU'S) WHERE A NON-MOVING 1972 RESPONDENT WAS IN RESIDENCE WITH A TWO-THIRDS SUBSAMPLE OF THE HU'S THAT

1972 RESPONDENTS HAD VACATED AND A TWO-THIRDS SUBSAMPLE OF HU'S THAT HAD ZERO CHANCE OF SELECTION IN 1972 FOR ONE OF THE FOLLOWING REASONS: (1) THEY WERE OVERLOOKED PREVIOUSLY; (2) THEY RESULTED FROM CONVERSIONS OF VACANCIES AFTER 1972; OR, (3) THEY RESULTED FROM NEW CONSTRUCTION AFTER 1972. TWO-THIRDS WAS USED AS A SUBSAMPLING FRACTION FOR HU'S ADDED TO THE PANEL HU'S SIMPLY BECAUSE THE BUDGET DID NOT ALLOW US TO TAKE INTERVIEWS IN ALL THESE HOUSEHOLDS.

THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE 1976 CROSS-SECTION SAMPLE WAS ACCOMPLISHED IN THE FOLLOWING MANNER:

- 1. TREATMENT OF PANEL HOUSEHOLDS:

 A. THE PANEL MEMBER STILL LIVED AT THE 1972 HU AND NO NEW MEMBERS HAD BEEN ADDED TO THE HOUSEHOLD:

 "NEW" MEMBERS MEANS ANYONE WHO HAD ZERO CHANCE OF SELECTION FOR THE 1972 STUDY. WHEN THE PANEL MEMBER WAS PRESENT AND THERE WERE NO NEW MEMBERS, THE PANEL MEMBER WAS ALSO THE CROSS-SECTION RESPONDENT.
 - B. THE PANEL MEMBER WAS STILL LIVING AT THE SAMPLE HU, BUT ONE OR MORE NEW MEMBERS WERE PRESENT IN THE HOUSEHOLD: INTERVIEWERS WERE INSTRUCTED TO LIST ALL ELIGIBLE HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS AND TO CHOOSE ONE OBJECTIVELY. IF THE CHOSEN PERSON WAS NOT AN ELIGIBLE HOUSEHOLD MEMBER IN 1972, A CROSS-SECTION INTERVIEW WAS ATTEMPTED WITH THE OBJECTIVELY SELECTED CHOSEN PERSON; OTHERWISE THE PANEL MEMBER WAS DESIGNATED RESPONDENT FOR THE CROSS-SECTION STUDY AS WELL AS FOR THE PANEL.
- 2. TREATMENT OF NON-PANEL HOUSEHOLDS: TWO-THIRDS OF THE 1972 VACANT HU'S, AND HU'S PRODUCING NON-RESPONSES, OR PRE-ELECTION ONLY RESPONSES WERE CHOSEN FOR THE CROSS-SECTION SAMPLE. IN THIS CASE, ALL HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS EIGHTEEN YEARS AND OVER WERE LISTED AND AN INTERVIEW ATTEMPTED WITH ONE OBJECTIVELY SELECTED RESPONDENT (SEE LESLIE KISH, "A PROCEDURE FOR OBJECTIVE RESPONDENT SELECTION WITHIN THE HOUSEHOLD," JOURNAL OF THE AMERICAN STATISTICAL ASSOCIATION, 44 (SEPTEMBER, 1949), PP. 38-387.
- 3. TREATMENT OF 1976 HU'S NONEXISTENT IN 1974: INTERVIEWERS WERE INSTRUCTED TO UPDATE THE HU LISTINGS FOR EACH SAMPLE SEGMENT. TWO-THIRDS OF THE NEWLY ADDED HU'S WERE INCLUDED IN THE CROSS-SECTION SAMPLE. AT EACH OF THESE HU'S, HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS EIGHTEEN YEARS OF AGE AND OVER WERE LISTED AND AN INTERVIEW ATTEMPTED WITH AN OBJECTIVELY SELECTED RESPONDENT.
- 4. 1974 CROSS-SECTION ONLY AT 1972 ADDRESSES: THESE ARE RESPONDENTS WHO WERE 1974 CROSS-SECTION RESPONDENTS WHO CONTINUE TO RESIDE AT HU'S SELECTED FOR THE 1976 CROSS-SECTION. ALL OF THESE RESPONDENTS WERE INCLUDED IN THE 1976 CROSS-SECTION SAMPLE IF THEY SATISFIED EITHER OF THE FOLLOWING CRITERIA, AS IN 1B, ABOVE: (A) NO NEW

MEMBERS HAD BEEN ADDED TO THE HOUSEHOLD SINCE 1974; OR (B) NEW MEMBERS HAD BEEN ADDED TO THE HOUSEHOLD BUT THE RESPONDENT INTERVIEWED IN 1974 WAS OBJECTIVELY SELECTED FROM THE ELIGIBLE 1976 MEMBERS. IF THE SELECTION PROCEDURE CHOSE NEW MEMBERS, INTERVIEWS WERE TAKEN WITH A TWO-THIRDS SUBSAMPLE.

THE SAMPLE DESIGN EMPLOYED FOR THE 1976 CROSS-SECTION PRODUCES A REPRESENTATIVE SAMPLE OF UNITED STATES CITIZENS, EIGHTEEN YEARS OLD AND OLDER RESIDING WITHIN THE FORTY-EIGHT CONTIGUOUS STATES WHEN THE APPROPRIATE SAMPLE WEIGHTS (DESCRIBED BELOW) ARE APPLIED. THESE WEIGHTS ARE NECESSARY TO BRING ABOUT EQUIVALENCE BETWEEN THE TWO-THIRDS SUBSAMPLED HU'S AND THE HU'S WHERE NON-MOVING PANEL MEMBERS WERE FOUND TO RESIDE.

>> 1976 WEIGHTING INFORMATION

THE 1976 CPS AMERICAN NATIONAL ELECTION STUDY SAMPLE CONSISTED OF PANEL AND CROSS-SECTION COMPONENTS. THE RECONTACTED RESPONDENTS FORMING THE PANEL WERE FIRST INTERVIEWED IN THE PRE- AND POST-ELECTION PHASES OF THE 1972 CPS AMERICAN NATIONAL ELECTION STUDY, AND THEN AGAIN IN THE 1974 CPS AMERICAN NATIONAL ELECTION STUDY. OF THESE PANEL RESPONDENTS, 1,005 WERE PART OF THE 1976 CROSS-SECTION SAMPLE. THESE RESPONDENTS WERE GIVEN A SELF-WEIGHT OF 1. TO FORM A REPRESENTATIVE CROSS-SECTION SAMPLE OF ADULTS 18 YEARS OF AGE AND OVER, 1,243 NON-PANEL RESPONDENTS WERE SELECTED BY SUBSAMPLING THE 1972 SAMPLE OF HOUSING UNITS AT A TWO-THIRDS FRACTION. CONSEQUENTLY, THESE CROSS-SECTION (NON-PANEL) RESPONDENTS WERE GIVEN A WEIGHT OF 1.5.

THE UNWEIGHTED N IS 2,248, BUT APPLICATION OF THE WEIGHTS YIELDS AN N OF 2,868.5. THE WEIGHT VARIABLE (V763003) MUST BE EMPLOYED WHENEVER THESE DATA ARE USED IN ORDER TO OBTAIN A REPRESENTATIVE CROSS-SECTION OF THE VOTING POPULATION OF THE UNITED STATES IN 1976.

>> 1976 FREQUENCIES INFORMATION

THE FREQUENCIES USED IN THE CODEBOOK WERE OBTAINED BY APPLYING THE WEIGHT VARIABLE (V763003). THE FMERG PROGRAM USED TO GENERATE FREQUENCIES FOR THIS CODEBOOK ROUNDS OFF EACH CODE VALUE TO THE NEAREST INTEGER. CONSEQUENTLY, THE TOTAL N FOR MOST VARIABLES WILL RANGE BETWEEN 2,870 AND 2,872.

THERE ARE A FEW INSTANCES, HOWEVER, WHERE DUE TO THE LARGE NUMBER OF CODE CATEGORIES, EACH OF WHICH IS SUBJECT TO ROUNDING, THE TOTAL N IS INCREASED CONSIDERABLY. FOR EXAMPLE, V763923-V3925 (FOREIGN RELATIONS PROBLEMS--1ST - 3RD RESPONSES) HAVE TOTAL N'S OF 2,886, 2,884, AND 2,881, RESPECTIVELY. THE FREQUENCIES ADDENDUM, HOWEVER, REPORTS THE N WITH THE IMPLIED DECIMAL.

DEPENDING ON THE CONVENTIONS OF THE PROGRAMS USED, FREQUENCIES FOR INDIVIDUAL CODE VALUES MAY VARY BY A COUNT OF 1.

>> 1976 CODEBOOK INFORMATION

The following example from the 1948 NES study provides the standard format for codebook variable documentation.

Note that NES studies which are not part of the Time-Series usually omit marginals and the descriptive content in lines 2-5 (except for variable name).

- Line 2 VARIABLE NAME. Note that in the codebook the variable name (usually a 'number') does not include the "V" prefix which is used in the release SAS and SPSS data definition files (.sas and .sps files) for all variables including those which do not have 'number' names. For example the variable "VERSION" in the codebook is "VVERSION" in the data definition files.

- Line 3 COLUMNS. Columns in the ASCII data file (.dat file).
- Line 4 CHARACTER OR NUMERIC. If numeric and the variable is a decimal
 rather than integer variable, the numer of decimal places is
 also indicated (e.g. "NUMERIC DEC 4")
- Line 5 Values which are assigned to missing by default in the Study's SAS and and SPSS data definition files (.sas and .sps files).
- Line 7 Actual question text for survey variables or a description of non-survey variables (for example, congressional district).

 Survey items usually include the question number (for example "Bla.") from the Study questionnaire; beginning in 1996 non-survey items also have unique item numbers (for example "CSheet.1").
- Line 9 A dashed or dotted line usually separates question text from any other documentation which follows.
- Line 10- When present, annotation provided by Study staff is presented below the question text/description and preceding code values.
- Lines 11-16

 Code values are listed with descriptive labels. Valid codes (those not having 'missing' status in line 5) are presented first, followed by the values described in line 5. For continuous variables, one line may appear providing the range

of possible values. A blank line usually separates the 'valid' and 'missing' values.

Lines 11-16

Marginals are usually provided for discrete variables. The counts may be unweighted or weighted; check the Study codebook introductory text to determine weight usage.

>> 1976 FILE STRUCTURE
